2020 Season President's Report



I am pleased to report that in spite of the challenge of dealing with an unprecedented global pandemic, club members have been enjoying some great summer weather and good flying conditions since we opened the field on June 7th. Thanks to Vice President and Webmaster, Zoltan Pittner, our online field booking system has been working flawlessly. This was the main reason our

field was able to open weeks before other clubs that relied on City of Toronto permits to operate.

In spite of these challenges, we have made remarkable progress in maintaining and upgrading our facilities this year. We replaced the badly worn shingles on the shelter roof, upgraded our charging capacity, and completed the north side of the GeoTextile runway. We installed an experimental rubber roofing material for the main taxiway which is holding up nicely. Our grass cutting team has kept the field surface rolled smooth and cut short and our student instruction program has never been more active under the direction of our dedicated Chief Flight Instructor, Randall Thomas.

I want to thank all members for doing such a great job in following all the required health and safety protocols. Because of this and because Ontario guidelines now permit larger gatherings, we are going ahead with a Fall Fun Fly on Saturday September 12th. This will be a great time to catch up with friends. The flying has been great this summer so far, but I for one have missed the social interaction with other members because of the limited access rules forced upon us in the early summer.

Great! How Do I Win?


Here's how it will work. The way to increase your odds of winning is by participating as described below to earn as many raffle tickets as you can. The more tickets in the box with your name on them, the greater your chances of your ticket being drawn. But everybody can participate and has a chance to win. Here's how to play and win....

- Show up at the field and show your 2020 Humber Valley member card and as long as you are still warm and breathing → <u>Get one raffle ticket</u>.
- Bring any airplane and have at least one flight and land safely in one piece → <u>Get one raffle ticket</u>.
- Crash any airplane ending up with two or more separate pieces - too bad but → <u>Get two raffle tickets!</u>
- 4) Spot land on the runway between the chalk markers verified by any witness → <u>Get one raffle ticket</u>. Note: You can only claim a spot landing ticket once but every time you fly for sport or try the IMAC sequence on page 3, you may attempt a spot landing.
- 5) Attempt the IMAC Basic 2020 described on page 3 and complete at least 2 maneuvers → Get one raffle ticket.

That's right! All you have to do is give it the old college try and participate and you will increase your chances of winning a prize. When you earn a ticket, just go to the ticket table and claim your ticket from our raffle ticket officer. Write your name and phone number on a raffle ticket and drop it in the box. That's all there is to it! Good luck!

Raffle Draw Rules:

- 1) All tickets earned up to the time of the draw are eligible to win prizes.

There is a great video on YouTube that you can watch to see how an expert flyer executes this sequence. This is the IMAC BASIC 2020 sequence used in this year's competitions. What the heck did we do before YouTube?


This year's sequence is:

- 1) Loop
- 2) Half Cuban 8
- 3) Hammerhead (Stall Turn)
- 4) 360° Aerobatic Turn
- Humpty Bump; vertical upline, ½ inside loop over the top, ½ roll on vertical downline
- 6) Reverse Shark's Tooth
- 7) Horizontal line with 1 roll
- 8) Laydown Humpty Bump
- 9) Immelmann
- 10) 1 & 1/2 Turn Spin

Final Reminders - COVID-19 Protocols

It's easy to forget and let our guard down when we are out enjoying ourselves but we must still follow Ontario guidelines and our own club rules so ...



- Bring a mask and wear it if there are too many people near you unless you can be sure that you are more than 6 feet away from everyone.
- 2) Use hand sanitizer if you touch any common surfaces like the charging station.
- 3) We decided to keep the gate open and unlocked for this event. There will be a lot of pilots coming and going and we want to minimize touching of the chain and lock. This will also save time and allow your guests to come and go.
- 4) Last person leaving must lock the gate
- 5) You must still book time at the field using the online Field Booking Form if you are coming to the Fun Fly. Don't forget to enter the names of any guests you invite.
- Please allow only our volunteer BBQ cooks to handle food and serve it on your plate. Avoid touching any common serving utensils.
- 7) All airplanes must have ID labels and you must hang your member and MAAC cards on the frequency board.
