# **Humber Valley Meeting Announcement**


Wed Feb 6<sup>th</sup> 2019 @ 7:30pm **Weston Golf and Country Club**

## Feb 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting Hot Topics - Drone Policy

#### **Background**

Our Constitution states that the purpose of Humber Valley RC Flyers is "the advancement and safe enjoyment, to the fullest extent possible, of the



recreational and competitive activity of radio control fixed wing model aircraft."

The club however recognizes that the rapid advancement of technologies has led to a surge in popularity of multi-rotor aircraft including helicopters, STOL aircraft, and drones. Current policies allow multi-rotor flying under certain conditions while at the same time preserve the rights of fixed wing flyers in accordance with the Constitution and purpose of the club.

#### Policies Prior to 2019

- 1) Students are not permitted to fly multi-rotor aircraft.
- Cleared fixed wing pilots are permitted to fly multi-rotor aircraft at the heli-port and on the main field as limited below.
- 3) The operation of any multi-rotor aircraft on the main field is prohibited while any fixed wing flying is taking place unless, by unanimous consent of all fixed wing pilots present at the field at any given time permission is granted to allow multirotor flights for that time period.

#### Additional Policies as of January 14, 2019

- 4) Multi-rotor only applicants (i.e. those without fixed wing flying intention or skills) may be recommended to the Executive Committee for acceptance as a member with "Pilot" status. Applications will be considered for approval if:
  - a) The applicant is endorsed by an existing member.
  - b) The applicant is responsible and respectful of club safety rules.
  - c) The applicant is a competent multi-rotor pilot.
  - d) The applicant completes the club's current flight training lessons #1 and #2.
  - e) The applicant agrees to follow all existing club safety and field operations guidelines and MAAC guidelines as stated on the application form.
  - f) Once accepted into the club and issued a "Pilot" card, the member agrees not to attempt to fly fixed wing aircraft without enrolling first in the club's flight training program and being explicitly cleared for fixed wing flight.
- 5) There is currently no multi-rotor "Student" class. However it is the intention of the club to develop a vetting process in the future that would allow for the acceptance of multi-rotor students, pending the creation of a training program that could be supervised by qualified instructors. The club does not have the resources currently to administer such a program and is also waiting to review and assess the impact of new Transport Canada Guidelines which will take effect on June 1, 2019. There is no current timeline or commitment to members or applicants as to when, or if, new policies will be approved by the executive.

# Feb 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting Hot Topics - Transport Canada Regulations for Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (RPAS)

You have probably heard about Transport Canada's new policy announcement released on January 10<sup>th</sup>. Now all RC aircraft including drones and helicopters will be covered by new regulations under the name of a Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (RPAS).

Here is the latest communication from MAAC. We will discuss this and answer all your questions at the Feb 6<sup>th</sup> meeting.

#### Re: Transport Canada Gazette II news release of Jan 10/19

We would like to advise you that the anticipated new regulations for Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (RPAS) have now been published. However, it should be clearly understood that nothing has changed for MAAC members and even though the regulations have now been published, they do not take effect until 1st June 2019. Until that date the *Interim Order Respecting the use of Model Aircraft* remains in effect, and as this order does not apply to MAAC operations, MAAC members can continue to operate as we always have.

Once the new regulations do come into effect, they will apply to all aircraft without a pilot onboard, whether for recreational or non-recreational purposes. However, be assured that MAAC continues to working with Transport Canada to ensure your current privileges are protected. As we advised you in the last email update, MAAC is working with Transport Canada on an exemption from the new regulations. With this exemption, once the new regulations do come into effect, MAAC members will enjoy the same freedoms they always have. It is expected that the MAAC exemption will be approved well before the new regulations come into effect on 1st June 2019. In the meantime please see the attached letter from Transport Canada, Letter – AARV – MAAC 2019 – 01-09 showing their commitment to these ongoing efforts and the preservation of our privileges.

MAAC leadership continues to work for its members and to ensure that we can all enjoy our passion of operating model aircraft. We will provide additional updates, once we have secured the exemption. Until then, please let me repeat that nothing has changed for MAAC members and you can continue to operate as you always have.
