President's Message

We are getting many questions from members about the current suspension of flying by MAAC. One question that keeps coming up is about the possibility of flying models that are less than 250 grams at our field. We are complying with the request from MAAC to cease all flying operations, even those under 250 grams. MAAC is actively



negotiating with Transport Canada, and we as executive, do not want to compromise their position by allowing any flying at our field. The main reason behind this is that since our field is in controlled airspace, we need a breakthrough - in form of a new exemption for MAAC - to be allowed to fly again at our current field location.

All of you can help make this happen by following the instructions in the recent email sent by Tom on how to send a letter to the Minister of Transport, your MP and perhaps the Shadow Minister of Transport on the opposition side. While MAAC is negotiating, they need all the support from the community they can get – and by sending letters, hundreds, thousands of letters, the Minister will realize that they have to deal with this issue and fix it for us.

We are actively searching for alternate field locations, which are outside of controlled airspace. As you can imagine, this is not easy, but if you, as a club member, are aware of any location we might be able to use for flying, please let us know and the executive will explore that option. This is not only our job as executive, but also your job as a member of the club. This is our club we all need to keep an eye open and find an alternate solution to be able to fly again outside of controlled airspace.

Regardless of how this ends up, it seems that any RC flying in Canada is almost certainly going to require pilots to pass Transport Canada's Small Basic RPAS Certification exam. In preparation for that, I have created a web page which contains all the required information and links that you will need to study and pass the Small Basic RPAS exam. You will find it on our web site under the "Members" tab. Or use this link:

So until we hear more news from MAAC, heads up folks, we are fighting for you and for all RC pilots in Canada, and we will let you know as soon as we have any further information.

Background

The Model Aeronautics Association of Canada (MAAC) was founded in 1949 to regulate and insure the operation Radio Controlled (RC) flying models in Canada. It publishes



safety rules and guidelines, developed a pilot wings training program, provides liability insurance for members, and sanctions over 500 flying fields and hundreds of RC flying competitions and events each year across Canada. There are about 10,000 active members plus we estimate at least 10 times that number of Canadians that enjoy the sport of RC flying.

In 2019 Transport Canada (TC) introduced new restrictions on the flying of model airplanes and drones, collectively referred to by TC as Remotely Piloted Aircraft Systems (RPAS), via Part IX of the Canadian Aviation Regulations (CAR) SOR/96-433. But up until November of 2022, TC had allowed MAAC members and clubs to fly at MAAC sanctioned flying fields under an exemption to the CAR regulations Part IX. That meant that MAAC members did not have to pass strict TC tests for RPAS flying, did not need to register every single flying model or drone and could fly up to 700 feet even in controlled airspace.

In over 70 years, to our knowledge, there has never been an incident of a MAAC member model, flying at a MAAC sanctioned field, interfering with any commercial or private airplane. However, due to a minor administrative error at MAAC, TC has now revoked the exemption to Part IX that we have enjoyed since 2019 and has effectively grounded all RC hobby flying in Canada. The regulations of Part IX are very restrictive and unfairly punitive towards safe RC hobby enthusiasts that want to fly at MAAC sanctioned fields.

Letter Campaign

Because of all this, we have been in daily contact with our Zone Director and initiated a letter campaign to ask our Minister of Transport and others to urgently encourage TC to come to the table with a new exemption that would allow us to fly. You should have received the email and letter template for this. If you have not already done so, please mail the letter(s) today! It is important to flood the Minister with letters to make him understand how desperate the situation has become.

RPAS Certificates

We are fairly certain that no matter what happens between TC and MAAC, you will need to pass at least your RPAS Basic test and receive your RPAS Basic Pilot Certificate. Then you will have to register all your models with TC at a fee of \$5.00 each. That will at least allow you to fly RC up to 25Kg in uncontrolled airspace on private property with owner permission. Flying at MAAC sanctioned fields is still suspended by MAAC until they can issue new Site Operation Certificates (SOCs). To get ready for these changes, we will be collecting RPAS certificates from members who have passed their Basic or Advanced RPAS exam and we will update this information on our web site.

If you are a MAAC member you should have received several updates on this situation from MAAC. Keep watch for more updates and meanwhile, we recommend you start working on getting your Basic RPAS Certificate and register your models.

Field Clean Up Day and BBQ Sat May 6th - 10am


Mark your calendars and help the club start the season on Sat May 6th. We need your help to get the field ready for spring. We will provide the necessary gloves and garbage bags.

If you renew for 2023, we will extend your membership to 2024 as well. It's the least we can do in return for your support!


The renewal process is totally automated and online. Here is how to renew:

2023 Annual General Meeting Report

Administrative Items: The Annual General Meeting was held on February 1st, 2023 at the Weston Golf and Country Club. The meeting was



very well attended with over 20 members present. President **Zoltan Pittner** called the meeting to order at 7:45pm. Tom Gottlieb announced that the current 2023 paid member count was 56 and that there were 28 members represented either in person at the meeting or by proxy. Therefore, we had exactly 50% of the membership represented. According to our constitution, a quorum of 25% of the current paid up 2023 membership is required for the AGM and 33% of the current year's membership is required for a valid vote on the proposed changes to the Constitution. Therefore, the AGM was declared valid and could proceed.

Zoltan Pittner read the proposed agenda for the meeting. John Deakin moved to approve the agenda as presented and this was seconded by **Bob Bader** and carried. Secretary **Milt Charlton** read the minutes of the 2022 AGM which were published in the March 2021 Flyer. **Bruce Gillespie** moved to approve the minutes which was seconded by **David Edwards** and carried.

Executive Reports:

President **Zoltan Pittner** provided a good review of the year's activities which was published in the Feb/Mar 2023 Flyer and painted a picture of a very successful year. However, he went on to describe the reason MAAC decided to suspend all flying in Canada and what could be done to restore access to our field or other sites. The executive is working hard to look into a possible alternative site in Maple as well as taking other routes to bypass MAAC's required permission through the establishment of a Special Operations Certificate (SFOC) from Transport Canada for the club. He invited any members with innovative ideas to step forward to help in this effort.

Treasurer Bruce Gillespie presented the financial statements for the fiscal year ending October 31, 2022 and budget for the following fiscal year November 01, 2022 through October 31, 2023. Revenues were \$13,969.75 while expenses were only \$6,888.45 resulting in a record surplus of \$7,081.30. This was higher than previous years due to the surge in membership caused by other clubs closing their fields and over \$2,200 in donations generated from past members and estates donating airplanes and equipment to the club which were sold to raise funds. Bruce noted that our account at Tangerine had been closed without our knowledge and funds transferred to our main TD Bank chequing account. The executive will look into investing the surplus funds in short term GICs in case funds are needed to develop a new field in the near future. The proposed budget included normal expenses plus an extra \$1,500 for the planned purchase of additional deep cycle batteries for our solar charging station. Bruce reminded the membership that the Constitution allows the executive to spend budgeted items plus up to 10%. Zoltan Pittner moved to approve the Financial Statements and Budget which was seconded by Ian Deakin and carried.

Field Officer **Ethan Earle** thanked **Randall Thomas** for collaborating on field maintenance and all the members who

helped install the runway extension which was very well received and used by all pilots. The mower was sent in for major service last spring and is running well. Ethan announced that he would be stepping down as Field Officer due to personal time restrictions but would remain on to help wherever he could.

Program Director **Walter Lam** reported a successful summer Fun Fly and our first ever Outdoor Swap Meet as well as indoor flying at the Kitchener/Waterloo airport hangar where he works. Unfortunately, our New Year's Day Fun Fly and February Frozen Finger events had to be cancelled due to the MAAC flying suspension. He also announced that he would be stepping down as Program Director in favor of running to fill the position of Field Officer.

Chief Flight Instructor **Randall Thomas** reported a successful year of student instruction. He was very busy certifying new members that joined the club this year from other clubs. He is looking forward to a successful 2023 season pending resolution by MAAC of the suspension and restoration of our Transport Canada Article 9 exemption.

Elections:

- Zoltan Pittner stood for re-election as President.
- Tom Gottlieb would therefore continue as Past President.
- Paul McMillan stood for re-election as Vice President.
- Walter Lam stepped down as Program Director and accepted the nomination to run for Field Officer.
- Bruce Gillespie stood for re-election as Treasurer.
- Ethan Earle stepped down as Field Officer.
- Milt Charlton Stepped down as Secretary.
- John Kita was introduced and welcomed by Tom Gottlieb accepted the nomination for Program Director.
- Gaetano Nicolo was introduced and welcomed by Tom Gottlieb and accepted the nomination for Secretary.

Zoltan Pittner thanked Milt Charlton and Ethan Earl for their service to the club and welcomed John Kita and Gaetano Nicolo to the Executive Committee. As there were no other members running for other executive positions, all the above candidates were acclaimed unanimously without objection.

The executive reappointed **Randall Thomas** as Chief Flight Instructor and Safety Officer. Randall accepted the appointment.

Constitution:

Tom Gottlieb explained the changes to the Constitution that were proposed in the Dec/Jan 2022/2023 Flyer and summarized again in the Feb/Mar 2023 Flyer. **Vince Albano** made a motion to approve the proposed changes which was seconded by **Gaetano Nicolo** and carried.

Closing

As there was no other business, **Bob Bader** moved to close the AGM at 9:15pm which was seconded by **Milt Charlton** and carried.
