President's Message - Difficult Times

If your MAAC membership is current, then you would have received two recent update emails from the MAAC President (Apr 13 & 25) about their progress in issuing the new Site Operating Certificates to various MAAC sanctioned fields. I know it is all very confusing but here is a SIMPLIFIED summary of where things stand.



- 1) First of all, NOT ALL aerodromes (think commercial airports, private airfields, heliports, etc.) are surrounded by controlled airspace circles. Only aerodromes with operating <u>flight air traffic control towers</u> have defined controlled airspace circles. The larger the airport the larger the circle. Smaller aerodromes (like small town airports and private fields) are not controlled but have rules about what you can and cannot do within 3 nautical miles.
- Since 2019 MAAC sanctioned clubs have been able to fly model airplanes between 250g and 25Kg under the terms of an exemption to the Canadian Aviation Regulations (CAR) Part IX.
- All MAAC sanctioned fields were closed in November 2022 because of administrative errors at MAAC that violated the conditions of the exemption.
- 4) Since that time MAAC has been busy re-writing safety rules and procedures and started to issue new Site Operating Certificates (SOCs) to clubs whose fields are not in controlled airspace.
- 5) Clubs that have received new SOCs are now able to fly provided they comply with all terms of CAR Part IX. Mainly this means:
 - a. All pilots must pass the RPAS Basic Certificate exam.
 - All models must be registered with Transport Canada at \$5.00 each.
 - All pilots must maintain maintenance logs of their aircraft.
 - Pilots must file a site survey with the new RPAS Wilco application before the first flight of the day at any site.
- 6) Until now, only fields in uncontrolled airspace have been candidates for the new SOCs. There are 378 such fields and so far, 282 have been issued SOCs with 96 still to go.
- 7) Unfortunately, our field is just inside the controlled airspace circle of Pearson Airport so we are one of the additional 76 clubs in <u>controlled airspace</u> and cannot fly even under CAR Part IX unless a new exemption is approved from Transport Canada. The most recent update from MAAC says they are finally getting to the point of meeting with NAV Canada and Transport Canada early in May to discuss proposals that would lead to a new exemption allowing fields in controlled airspace to open.

Discussion

This is a lot to process but it means that we will still be closed for some time and possibly lose the whole 2023 flying season. As your executive, we have had lengthy meetings and discussions to see if there is anything else we can do. The Internet forums have lit up with anger and frustration against

MAAC for getting us into this situation and we share much of this sentiment. However, MAAC has been around for over 70 years, and it seems hasty to abandon MAAC even if they have made bad decisions that they are trying to correct.

It should not surprise you that some clubs have left MAAC or are talking about it, but these are mostly clubs that are NOT in controlled airspace so they have better options. But, since Humber Valley is in controlled airspace, it is not clear that we can achieve permission to fly without MAAC. And breaking from MAAC or giving up your MAAC membership, makes it illegal for you to fly at any MAAC sanctioned competitions or events or any MAAC sanctioned field that does have a SOC.

Conclusions

So for now, we are pushing MAAC hard but we are also trying to be patient and let them do their work. Many of you are looking for or have found other clubs to join. We are also negotiating with other clubs to see if we can get permission to fly at other fields for selected dates or events in 2023.

Club Membership

Since the field is currently closed, we have decided not to accept new members until further notice. Also as previously announced, your 2023 Humber Valley membership will remain good through 2024. You can download and print a new 2024 membership card from the cub website in the member section.

Spring Cleanup and BBQ

We are still scheduled to hold our usual spring cleanup and BBQ because we still need to maintain the field while all this is going on. This is also a good chance to get together to see old friends after a long winter. See the notice in this Flyer. Hope you can make it.

Swap Meet

This is still a go at the moment. See the notice in this Flyer.

Indoor Flying

We were able to book four indoor flying dates over the summer months. We hope this helps you get in some stick time. Never tried flying indoor? Come out and have a look. It's a blast!

RPAS Certificates

Regardless of how this ends up, it seems that any RC flying in Canada is almost certainly going to require pilots to pass Transport Canada's Small Basic RPAS Certification exam. In preparation for that, we have created a web page which contains all the required information and links that you will need to study and pass the Small Basic RPAS exam. 

Field Clean Up Day and BBQ Sat May 6th - 10am (Rain Date Sun May 7th)



Mark your calendars and help the club start the season on Sat May 6th. We need your help to get the field ready for spring. Here is a list of some of the work that needs to get done.

- General Trash clean up; entry-parking lot, field, helipad, runway edges - bring work gloves
- Fencing south of gate post; add metal fencing south of fencepost, add post between gate post and existing post.
- Trees: remove two dead trees at west end of field, remove stump between container and charging hut - requires digging out around tree trunk - and cutting out roots. Bring shovels, axe, saw.
- Geotextile Runway; make sure staples are set along edges, repair any tears.

Program Director **John Kita** will be pressing the BBQ into service for this event, so after the cleanup, stick around for food and fun. We will be restricted to the following other events:

- Ground RC car obstacle course and race. Bring in your electric RC vehicles to participate.
- Kite flying and aerobatic kite competition.
- Anybody have control line models? Bring it on!
