Yes! We Are Open!!!




No doubt about it. Humber Valley is open for business! Even though we are in Class C – controlled airspace, we are open and flying. We have all the necessary approvals and documents from MAAC including our Site Operations Certificate and approved safety rules which you can find on our web site.

Now the rest is up to you. You can come and fly sub 250g models anytime and we can help you pass your advanced RPAS exam and get your Advanced Flight Review.

Come on guys! What are you waiting for? The field has never been in better shape and there is still lots of late summer and fall flying left in 2024.

A Message from Randall Thomas



Take it from me. It's not that hard! Once you have your Advanced RPAS Certificate, you can go to the field, open the NavDrone App on your smartphone and it takes only about 60 seconds to clone a previous flight operation and start flying with full approval - and be fully CARS Part IX compliant.

The field has come back to life this season! We have about 15 certified advanced pilots, about 5 more who have passed their

advanced exam and are getting ready for Flight Reviews and about 20 others working on their advanced exam.

We are hoping to reach a critical mass of about 30 Advanced pilots by this time next year. You can schedule your flight review with me. See the June Flyer for instructions and contact me for help.

Site Surveys – What You Need to Know!

CARS Part IX requires that you know how to obtain and understand Site Surveys. The survey tells you the class of airspace you are in (always Controlled Class C for Humber's field), and what aerodromes are nearby. It also provides you with the Canada Flight Supplement (CFR) tables for each nearby aerodrome with the phone number to call in case of a fly away. Each survey refers to your planned flight as a "Mission".



You can get a Site Survey from the RPAS WILCO app on your smart phone or computer. It is an application developed by The RPAS Centre and is available for free to MAAC members. You identify where, when and what you plan to fly and the app generates the required

Site Survey. In addition to all the information noted above, the survey provides current NOTAMs and weather information.


The "LOOK UP" Weather Method!

Site surveys are mandatory but not that useful for RC flyers since we always fly at the same location. We already know that there are no cell towers or other obstacles at our field and if you want to know if the weather is OK for flying, try this: just "LOOK UP"! If it's not raining, snowing, hailing, foggy, or too windy – go flying!

Back-up Weather Station

As an alternative to the "LOOK UP" method, we offer this handy way for members to build their own weather station.



Site Survey Relief Schedule

More good news! You don't need your own new site survey every time you fly. You can share access to site surveys provided by other members or from our web site. MAAC requires surveys to be updated every 56 days to coincide with NAV Canada updates to the CFRs. We will post updated Site Surveys on our web site according to this schedule. A new site survey was just posted on September 5th in the Library Tab so you can always look at it from there on your phone or computer. The schedule of dates can be found in the Library Tab under Club Documents. It is called: MAAC NOTAM 2023-04 MAAC Site Survey Relief Options.


