

# **Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> Meeting Program Announcement**

Topic: Application of

**Autonomous Unmanned** 

Aerial Vehicles in

Wildfires

Speaker: Dr. Hugh H.T. Liu,

Professor, University of Toronto, Institute for Aerospace Studies

Dr. Hugh H.T. Liu is an internationally leading researcher in the area of aircraft systems and control, and he



leads the "Flight Systems and Control" (FSC) Research Laboratory. Dr. Liu has published over 100 technical papers in peer reviewed journals and conference proceedings, and he has received one patent (US and Canada) on his work on motion synchronization. He has significant research contributions in autonomous unmanned systems development, cooperative control, and integrated modeling and simulation. Before his academic appointment, Dr. Liu had several years' industrial experience where he participated and led development projects of aircraft environmental control systems.

Dr. Liu will talk about the Institute for Aerospace Studies and his work there using Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) in Wildfires. This presentation covers recent research and development on autonomous UAVs with a focus is on their commercial applications. He will describe how multiple UAVs in formation flight can be used for wild fire monitoring. (Editor's Note: How cool is that?) From a technical perspective, wildfire monitoring and fighting requires near real-time information on where and how wildfires spread in order to plan and execute emergency response strategies. Satellite imaging of wildfires may have insufficient resolution to detect small-scale fires or may not deliver required real time information on the spread of fires. Fire inspection through piloted aviation may put pilots at risk, or may be limited by resources or weather conditions. With recent developments in unmanned vehicle systems (UVS) technology, researchers around the world have been exploring the use of unmanned vehicles, often including both unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) and ground vehicles (UGVs), to provide real-time wildfire monitoring.


### 2015 Renewal Reminder

### Saying Goodbye to a Good Friend - Barry Collingwood

I am sorry to have to report that Barry Collinwood passed away on October 30 after fighting a brain tumor since March 2013. Barry was an immense force in the early years of Humber Valley and was a good friend to us all. He loved to fly and worked tirelessly to make the club better at every turn. He served as club president from 1982 to 1985. In 1976, the club was known as the Downsview RC flyers and in 1976 secured permission from the Provincial government to use a small plot of land in the Greenbelt that ran just North of Steeles Ave. East of Keele Street in the middle of a corn field. When Barry joined the club in 1979, the president was Pat Knight and the Chief Flying Instructor was Eric Peckham. There were about 30 members in 1979.

In 2012 Barry wrote an extensive history of the club which you can find on our web site in the Library section. It should be required reading for every new member. We owe our current flying site to Barry. Here is an excerpt from this interesting 9 page history:

While wondering around in the green belt area North of the tracks and South of Highway 7, looking for anything remotely flat and accessible, I ran across the landfill site where we now fly. There were a number of suitable locations North of the tracks as well but these locations did not have access. I checked with the Vaughn land office and found that the landfill site was under the control of the City of Toronto Parks and Recreation. It had been turned over to them for maintenance and eventual park use. Because of the methane issue it could not be formally used as a park for a number of years so was fenced and locked. One of the Club Members that I worked with at Ontario Hydro, Fred Roberts, happened to personally know the Superintendent of Parks as they were working together on a project to burn refuse to generate electricity (didn't get anywhere). Fred arranged to meet with him and described our plight. The Superintendent agreed to let us use the site and instructed the Parks Department to help us get settled in. They were quite pleased to see the site get some use. The club was renamed the Humber Valley R/C Flyers, I assumed the role of President and Chief Flying Instructor and we started developing the new site in 1982.

We could never repay Barry for all he has done for the club. Barry even developed our current web site and online membership database which is a huge asset to the club today. He was married to his wife Joanne for over 44 years. He will be sorely missed.

## Nov 5<sup>th</sup> Meeting Program Report 250 Size Mini FPV Racing - Zoltan Pittner
