

We are pleased to announce that Steve Szekely who retired from De Havilland about 10 years ago after working there for nearly 30 years in the machine shop will be speaking to us about his experience. Steve used to build wind tunnel test models for De Havilland and when he retired, started building Beavers and other airplanes from the original De Havilland plans. Steve has many stories about what it was like to work at De Havilland in its early years and has an album of photos he will bring for display and discussion. Steve is an accomplished builder and currently works at RC Sports and Hobbies. He built this Turbo Beaver shown below sporting an Inuit Raven art paint scheme.


