

# Indoor has started at North Albion Collegiate


We also want to remind you that we have started the winter indoor flying at North Albion Collegiate. The first session

## **Nov 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting Program Report Zoltan Pittner – 3D Printing!**



Well - you don't see that every day. Zoltan did not disappoint us at the November meeting. This was one of the most interesting and unusual presentations we have ever had at a Humber meeting. We had not one, not two, but three different 3D

printers going and after "printing" a 6" glider just to warm up. Zoltan went on to explain how this new technology works. You can make everything from servo mounts to household appliance parts. To finish off the evening, we saw a demonstration of the 3D software that lets you draw any 3D part and transfer it to the machine for printing.

> "Any sufficiently advanced technology is indistinguishable from magic."

#### Changing the Constitution – Tom Gottlieb



As indicated in the November Flyer, we will vote on the proposed changes to the constitution at the December 4<sup>th</sup> meeting. If you are coming to the meeting you can vote in person. During the November meeting the proposed changes were discussed and one additional change was adopted. This has to do with Article 3 which says:

#### Article 3. Purpose

The purpose of this Club shall be the advancement and safe enjoyment, to the fullest extent possible, of the recreational and competitive activity of radio control fixed wing model aircraft.

Due to the increasing presence of helicopters and multi-rotor machines, and the existence of the helicopter field, some members thought this article should be relaxed a bit to acknowledge and not exclude the use of rotary wing machines. Therefore a small change was discussed and adopted to say:

#### Article 3. Purpose

The main purpose of this Club shall be the advancement and safe enjoyment, to the fullest extent possible, of the recreational and competitive activity of radio control fixed wing model aircraft.

With this change. Tom Gottlieb proposed the motion to adopt the new constitution and it was seconded by Pat Knight. The vote will be held at the December 4th meeting.
