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


Humber Valley Meeting Announcement

and next month's Flyer. North Albion Collegiate Institute is located just south of the field at 2580 Kipling Avenue on the west side.


We will be discussing indoor flying at the November meeting. Come to find out all about indoor flying and see Tom's new mystery ship (photo right).

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Humber Valley Introduces New Field Solar Charging Station!!

This fall your executive approved the installation of a 12v solar power system installed on the roof of the shelter. Thanks goes out to **Bruce Gillespie** for this initiative and **Mike Gerace** for all his efforts installing the system. You did a great job Mike!

The purpose of this system is to provide a 12 volt power source for chargers so that you can charge your Rx, Tx, and flight

batteries at the field. The system uses a 12 volt storage battery which is recharged using solar cells.

Some facts are:

This is a limited system. Any solar power system is designed around the power demands you want to satisfy. However, in our case we do not know what the power demands will be, we can only speculate. This system will provide enough power to recharge flight batteries, even the larger sizes. The system can provide up to 50 amp hours without recharging.

The system is continually charging when the sun shines. We do not know how fast the battery will be recharged, that will depend on the amount



of amps used and how much the sun shines! Solar panel output is 90 watts max.

The storage battery used is a size 31 Motomater Nautilus Marine deep-cycle battery (flooded/wet) (ctc#010-3199)

- 12 Volts
- 205 reserve capacity minutes (@25 A)
- 115 amp hour capacity (20hrs)

The depth of discharge effects the life of the battery. We should not let the battery be discharged below 50% of its capacity.

How to use:

- 1. You must use your own charger.
- 2. In the First Aid Box you will find a gray electrical box with a red switch. It's on a 10' cord so you can put it on the table. You will find brass charging posts. Two are marked "Positive"; the other



two are marked "Negative". The two positive "+" posts are connected to each other so it does not matter which one you clip on. Same with the two negative "-" posts.

- 3. For power, you clip the power supply side of your charger to the brass charging posts. Turn the red switch to the "ON" position to give power to the charging posts.
- 4. Charge your battery as usual.
- 5. At the end of flying, please return the charging box to the First Aid box.

Things to consider:

- 1. Discharging the battery below 50% is shortens the life of the battery.
- 2. In any one day we can use 50 amps, but we do not know how fast it will recharge. Estimates are that the system will charge 3 to 6 amps per hour.
- 3. The system has limits. Charging small to medium batteries should not be a problem. If you intend to charge large battery packs, especially in a short period of time, please ensure it will not negatively impact the system or other flyers. The system should be shared between all users.

We do not have all the answers. Please post observations and any suggestions. Let us know how the system worked for you. The system is now operational with a fully charged battery as of Friday, Sept 28, 2012.

FLASH – Treasurer Bruce Gillespie Announces Membership and Fee Changes



It's getting close to that time of year again and we are planning the 2013 membership renewal drive starting at the November meeting. Here are changes we have introduced for 2013 to provide a better deal for members and encourage new members and juniors to join the club.

Here's the deal:

- Reduced Member Fee: Any full member renewal or new application received before December 31, 2012 will pay the new annual fee of \$75.00
- Late Member Fee: Full member renewal after December 31, 2012 will be charged a \$15.00 late renewal fee of \$15.00 for a total fee of \$90.00.
