Humber Valley is pleased to announce that Graeme Mears will be our guest speaker at the April 6th meeting. Graeme is a world class scale builder. In 2008 his F-16 Falcon in U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds paint scheme won first prize in Team Class and here is Graeme (left) holding the trophy to prove it!



This year Graeme is busy putting the finishing touches on a new jet - it is a 1/5th scale F-16C Flying Falcon in "Aggressor Camouflage Scheme" shown below. The Aggressor will be entered in the "scale jet" category at Toledo, and will be his "TeamScale" entry this year at Top Gun (April 28th - May 2nd). It will be flown by David Shulman, World RC Jet speed record holder.



This picture above of the original F-16 was taken on a "documentation" visit to Nellis AFB in Las Vegas, Nevada. Graeme will speak at the meeting on RC Scale Competition and his approach to achieving a perfect static score which is the secret to his success. Just to see this aircraft and hear how Graeme meticulously documents the build process in order to stay true to the original plane will be well worth attending the April meeting. Graeme's scale aircraft are known world-wide and are much sought after by collectors and model builders. His aircraft represent perfection in scale model RC aircraft construction.
