- Enforce a 5 airplane limit at one time
- · Assign safety monitors with authority to ground any flyer

Trial Float Site Report

Bruce Gillespie was the main catalyst for organizing a trial Float Fly which was held on June 13th. Vice President **Paul McMillan** helped with planning and supervised the event on behalf of the executive. The event was originally scheduled for June 6th but needed to be postponed due to logistics and weather.



The purpose of the event was to allow our MAAC Zone Director, Clair Murray, to evaluate the site's potential as a float site for our club. If you want to check out the site, it is located only 10 minutes from our current field at:

Indian Line Campground 7625 Finch Ave.W., Brampton, ON L6T 3Y7

To get there:

- Travel west from our flying field along Steeles Ave. (5 km)
- Turn south (left) on to Finch Ave.(first light west of Hwy 50)
- Travel south a short way, and turn in at the blue Indian Line Campground sign on your left, just after going under the railway bridge.
- The site is in the north east corner of the campground.



The event went verv well with about a dozen active float flyers participating. Bruce is expecting input back from Clair Murray before we will

know if MAAC approves it for future events. We did not see much in the way of curious crowds but Gary spoke to some folks living in a trailer in the camp. There was a good mix of

electric and nitro glow powered planes represented. Gary had a kayak there as a retrieval boat and Bruce setup a canopy for shade and a dining tent for shelter in case of rain.
