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


Humber Valley's Meeting Announcement Tues April 3rd, 2007 @ 7:30pm



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Motion: Helicopter Member Category

At the April meeting there is one motion which will be put to a vote. This motion has unanimous club Executive support.

Motion:

"Be it resolved that a new designation of membership be created called "Fixed Wing/Helicopter Member" and that the number of such memberships at any given time be limited and regulated by policies determined by the club Executive Committee in accordance with the best interests of the full club membership."

Rationale:

In recent years, the hobby has seen a significant increase in the popularity of helicopters due in large part to the availability of more affordable, reliable aircraft and related equipment. Over the past couple of flying seasons in particular, the number of members flying helicopters at the Club has risen from only one or two to a dozen or more.

In the interest of safety, the following Club Safety Rule currently places the following limitation on the operation of helicopters:

"Priority will be given to fixed wing flyers. Helicopter flying will be permitted only with the unanimous consent of all members present at the field at any given time. The operation of any helicopter, or its engine, is prohibited while any fixed wing flying is taking place."

To date, this arrangement has worked well for most members. However, with an ever-increasing number of helicopters, the above rule will likely become a point of contention between fixed-wing and helicopter flyers. For example, even if the fixed-wing pilots at the field are outnumbered by helicopter pilots, the fixed-wing pilots' consent would still be necessary for helicopter operation.

As outlined in Article 3 (Purpose) of the Constitution, the Club is primarily a fixed-wing aircraft organization. It reads:

"The main purpose of this Club shall be the advancement and safe enjoyment, to the fullest extent possible, of the recreational and competitive activity of radio control fixed wing model aircraft. The purpose is supported by the cooperation of all members with national and international modeling organizations and the general public."

This leaves the Club with two viable options:

- To maintain the status quo (priority given to fixed-wing aircraft, with an ever-growing growing number of helicopters), or
- To limit the number of members permitted to fly helicopters.

The main problem with option #1 is that, although the current situation is manageable, if more members purchase helicopters and new helicopter-only members join, the main purpose of the Club would be jeopardized. As well, with only one helicopter permitted to fly at a time, wait times for both fixed-wing and helicopter pilots would be excessive during busy times.

While the Executive wants to accommodate current helicopter pilots, it feels that it is imperative to maintain the club's status as a fixed-wing club first and foremost. Although there are a

number of helicopter clubs in the area, the number of fixedwing clubs is in decline. We feel that option #2, limiting the number of helicopter flyers, is the best compromise for both fixed-wing pilots and current helicopter flyers.

The Executive investigated several options that would address this and related issues, including the construction of a dedicated helicopter flying area to the southeast of the current flight line. This option will be re-evaluated by the executive following a supervised trial run this summer.

NOTE: It is the intent of the current Executive to publish helicopter policies that will grandfather existing members who wish to fly helicopters provided they apply for the new member category by April 30, 2007. The policy will describe how the 2007 season will be used as a transition year and explain what needs to be done to become certified for helicopter operation in future seasons. Club policies will be discussed in detail at the April meeting.
