

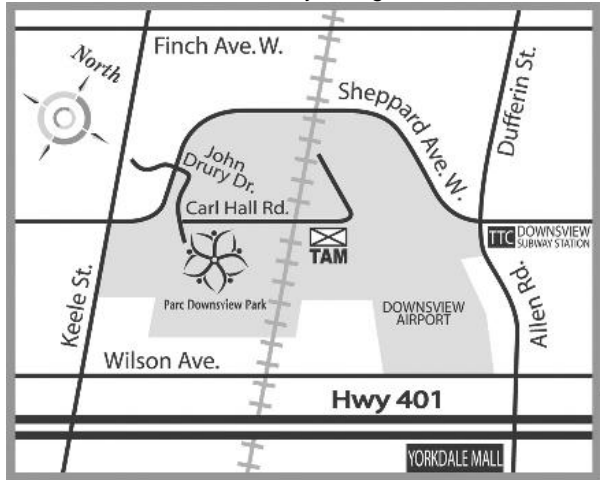


## Humber Valley's Meeting Announcement Tues Nov 6<sup>th</sup>, 2007 @ 7:30pm

## Helicopter Update

There was also some discussion about how the new helicopter rules were working out and Joseph Young pointed out that there were a number of members that got their certification from the Toronto Heli Club according to the rules that were approved last year.



However, there was also some misunderstanding about the rules concerning guest helicopter flying at the field. Joseph reminded members that since we are not qualified to clear helicopter pilots, we also cannot allow guest heli flying

at Humber Valley. This rule is part of the club's safety policy and is clearly printed on the Helicopter Application Form available on the club's web site. It is the responsibility of the Executive to set safety policy for the club and this is the current policy.

The Executive wishes to remind members and especially helicopter flyers that to fly choppers at the field next year, you will need to be certified. Also be reminded that guest heli flying is currently not permitted.

On a more positive note, Gary Del Bel Belluz has managed to arrange with the city to have a large load of earth dumped and leveled to the south and east of the shed which is being prepared for helicopter use. He is working with the city to have it seeded as soon as possible so there will be some grass growing in the spring. Helicopter flyers should contact Gary to volunteer with heli-port maintenance for next year.

Members who intentionally disregard cub policy and safety rules will have their flying privileges revoked. **Please govern yourself accordingly.**

## FLASH – Treasurer Announces New Early Bird Renewal Discount – Save \$15.00!

- 2) To be eligible for the discount, renew at the November or December meeting OR mail in your application to the treasurer's address on the form. As long as your application is **postmarked on or before Dec 31/07**, you can claim the discount.
- 3) The discount does not apply to the One Time Joining Fee, the Junior Fee or the Family Fee.
