


Humber Valley's Meeting Announcement Tues Dec 5th, 2006 @ 7:30pm

On Oct 5, 2006, the new commemorative full-scale model of the famous Avro Arrow, constructed by the Toronto Aerospace Museum, was unveiled at a special fundraising gala celebration. The program for the evening included cocktails, gourmet food and beverages, displays, gift shop, audio-visuals, speeches, and, of course, the dramatic unveiling of the Avro Arrow replica!

Visitors also got to see Bernie Lehman's RC Arrow perform a demonstration flight. Talk about pressure - how would you like to fly in front of a big crowd and newspaper



reporters at the gala Arrow celebration event? Bernie did great and impressed everyone. He said he saw his RC version of the Arrow as a tribute to those who worked on the real aircraft.
