


### Humber Valley's Meeting Announcement Tues Jan 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2006 @ 7:30pm

When Tom crashed his 5-year old Thunder Tiger fun fly this summer, he looked at it as a sign – someone was telling him to modernize his fleet. So seizing the opportunity, and after a little web research, he came upon this new state-of-the-art ARF. Distributed by Carolina 3D in Lexington, South Carolina, this 3D profile aerobat sports a carbon fiber wing joiner, carbon fiber pushrods and parts, a huge 53" wingspan and is a lightweight at only 4.5 lbs.

#### Winter Flying Tips

Heading out to the Humber Valley Club field this winter? Here are a few tips to make your trip more enjoyable. Dress warm!! Wear your ski or snowmobile clothing. Ideally, you can comfortably kneel or sit in the snow. The temperature of your hands is directly related to the temperature of your body. If you overdress slightly, your hands will last longer in the cold. Keep a \$1 chemical hand warmer in each coat pocket for added comfort. Bring a shovel and a tow strap! The field access road and parking lot is not plowed. Cars usually don't have a problem getting up the hill if there are tracks to follow. It's also a good idea to bring a cell phone — so you can call your flying buddies and tell them to get up to the field!
