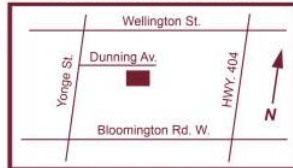

The northern half of our field is totally green now. We should avoid landing there until the remainder of the sticks and stones are collected and the area is rolled. We'll have to do all that during our spring clean-up day. The Parks crews have also graded the road and add gravel to the bad spots so we are set for winter and looking good! Toilet service will end November 1st.

The Parks Department has generously offered us unlimited use of a 70", three head, reel type mower. This machine can produce a very low cut and travels at a faster speed than our present 50" rotary mower. We will store both mowers in our shed over the growing season and return the big one for servicing in the fall. Get on the mower team next spring...it's like going for a drive in the country! A big thank you goes out to Jim Wakelin and his Metro West District Parks Department staff for all the great work in 2006 especially in filling, leveling and seeding the field.

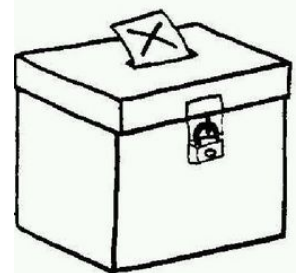
