


Humber Valley's Meeting Announcement Tues Oct 3rd, 2006 @ 7:30pm



This aerobatics competition will be open to all HVRCF members, and will follow the IMAC Basic Pattern, IMAC changes the sequence every year and below

is the 2006 version. Members interested in participating in the event should contact Dave Sanders or David Plank and let us know that you intend to compete so we can make plans accordingly. The 2006 sequence has some new twists so it should be a lot of fun this year. Also, we are holding the event in September so everyone should be back from summer vacations and be in good form to compete.

IMAC 2006 Basic Pattern

Below are the required maneuvers. They can be done from either direction depending on the wind direction.


- 1. Roll
- 2. Humpty Bump; vertical upline, ½ inside loop over the top, ½ roll on vertical downline
- 3. Half Reverse Cuban 8; pull to 45° upline with ½ roll, 5/8 inside loop
- Loop
- 5. Hammerhead
- 6. Sharks tooth; pull to 45° upline with ½ roll, pull to vertical downline, pull to exit level.
- 7. Figure 9; pull to vertical and pull a 5/8 loop
- 8. Half Cuban 8; 5/8 inside loop, ½ roll on 45° downline
- 9. Immelman; ½ inside loop, ½ roll
- 10. One and Half spin.

This year's IMAC pattern should be lots fun. We need new members to participate. You only need to be an intermediate flyer to run this pattern so come out and participate.
