





The following is a description of the positions open for nomination, extracted from the document entitled "HUMBER VALLEY R/C FLYERS M.A.A.C. CHARTER CLUB CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS (REVISED SEPT. 1995)" Article 2, Section 3 of the Bylaws:

President

- a) Supervise and direct the activities of the Executive.
- b) Promote the aims of the Club and provide leadership.
- c) Preside at all Club meetings and establish any committees required to conduct specific Club activities.
- d) Act as a Signing Officer for the Club.

Vice President

- a) Carry out in the President's absence all the duties of that office in accordance with the President's wishes.
- b) Take charge of all Club promotional activities. Act as a liaison between M.A.A.C. and the Club.
- c) Act as a signing officer for the Club.

Secretary

- a) Keep minutes of all meetings and if unable to attend, appoint a proxy to keep an accurate record, which will then be added to the Secretary's record of minutes.
- b) Receive and distribute Club correspondence.
- c) Maintain an inventory of all Club assets.

Treasurer/Membership Coordinator

- a) Collect, record and administer the revenues and expenditures of all Club funds.
- b) Produce an up-to-date financial report as requested.
- c) Assist the Auditor in any way as requested.
- d) Process and maintain accurate financial records of the membership.
- e) Act as a signing officer for the Club

Field Officer

- a) Ensure proper maintenance of the flying site by outside professionals or by enlisting of voluntary assistance from the membership.
- b) Be responsible for all Club property at the flying site.

Program Director

- a) Plan and arrange programs for regular Club meetings.
- b) Provide refreshments and the detailed social arrangements for Club functions.

Contest Director

a) Arrange all contest and flying meets, including the purchase and distribution of prizes.



At the November Meeting there will be three motions brought before the meeting for the members to vote on. All three motions have the support of, and are recommended by a majority of the club's Executive Committee.

Motion #1:

Be it resolved that the club embark on a one season experiment in self maintenance of the club field for the summer 2005 season, and that the executive be authorized to purchase a suitable lawn tractor, and appropriate storage facility for same.

Rationale #1:

Lawn maintenance fees have steadily increased from \$3200.00 in 1998, to the current cost of \$7000.00 (taxes included). Conversely, lawn equipment costs have reduced to the point where it is now possible to purchase a top quality lawn tractor, and secure storage facility for significantly less than we currently spend on one year of lawn maintenance.

In formulating the idea for this experiment, Executive members consulted with the R/C Club of Toronto, which has been cutting its own grass for over 40 years. They currently use a lawn tractor of 48" swath and 20 horsepower, identical to that proposed for this experiment. Based on their experience and the relative size of their field, it is estimated that the Humber Valley field will take approximately 2 hours to cut.

Two members have volunteered to cut the lawn twice a week for the duration of the experiment to help determine if self maintenance of the field is a viable option for the club.

If the experiment is a success, and the club opts to continue self maintenance in the following season, the club will begin to enjoy a savings of approximately \$6000 per year, starting in the 2006 season. These savings could then be translated in to on-going field improvements, more events, prizes and benefits to members, or even reduced membership fees.

Since the cost of purchasing the equipment and storage is less than the cost of the field maintenance contract for a single season, the experiment will cost the club nothing, and could produce an immediate savings of \$1000 - \$2000 in the 2005 season itself.

At the conclusion of the 2005 season, the membership will review the success of the experiment, and vote to either continue with self maintenance, or return to outsourcing field maintenance.



Motion #2

Be it resolved that Junior membership fees be increased to \$35 per junior member.

Rationale #2:

The Club reduced its junior membership fee in 1997 to \$10 in order to participate in a MAAC sponsored program to promote junior membership. However, MAAC abandoned that program some years ago, and announced a fee increase for junior memberships to \$18.75 at this past AGM. The club has a growing number of junior members just under 18 years old who are making good use of the field and the Student instruction program, and so it is felt that a membership increase for junior members is appropriate.

Motion #3:

Be it resolved that a "Family Membership" fee structure be introduced as follows: \$90 per open member, plus \$10 for each additional family member under the age of 18.

Rationale #3:

Junior members who join the club along with a parent are often younger than junior members who join the club on their own, and the younger junior members typically make much less use of the field. It is also felt that it is worth retaining the \$10 junior membership fee in cases where it encourages families to participate in club activities together.
