Grass Cutting

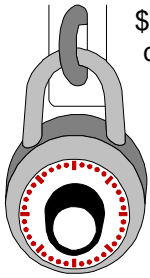

Helicopter flying will be permitted only with the unanimous consent of all members present at the field at any given time. The operation of any helicopter, or its engine, is prohibited while any fixed wing flying is taking place.”
